PROFESSOR BRENDA HAPPELL ACMHN LIFF MFMBFR 2019

Professor Brenda Happell is a registered nurse with specialist qualifications in mental health nursing. She is a passionate advocate for what she believes is the best profession in the world. Brenda has spent nearly three decades in leadership, teaching and researching roles in higher education. She was the inaugural Director of the Centre for Psychiatric Nursing, University of Melbourne, former Director of the Institute for Health and Social Science Research, Central Queensland University and Professor of Nursing and Executive Director of Synergy, Nursing and Midwifery Research Centre at University of Canberra and ACT Health. She is a Fellow of the Australian College of Mental Health Nurses and current Board Director. She has represented the college on working groups and steering committees and held many roles. Most notably Benda was Editor of the International Journal of Mental Health Nursing for 10 and a half years. Under her leadership the journal became the highest ranking mental health nursing journal, and ranked number five of all nursing and midwifery journals internationally. Brenda is a current Board Director of Mansfield District Hospital, an ambassador for Equally Well and was appointed an inaugural member of the Queensland Mental Health and Drug Advisory Council.

Brenda has authored approximately 450 peer reviewed publications, three books and nine book chapters. According to the SciVal data base, Brenda is world leader in publication in the areas of mental health nursing, consumer participation, nurse education and ranked second for mental health. Brenda has obtained approximately \$14 million in competitive research funding. She is frequently engaged as a keynote or invited speaker. Brenda has supervised 15 PhD students and three Masters by Research students to successful completion.

Brenda implemented the first known position for a mental health consumer academic at the University of Melbourne, followed by similar positions at Central Queensland University and University of Canberra. She is lead investigator of a National Health and Medical Research Council grant: Improving the cardiometabolic health of people with psychosis: The Physical Health Nurse Consultant service, a nurse-led initiative.

Brenda has received numerous awards including the Victorian Mental Illness Awareness Council (VMIAC) Inaugural lifetime Ally Award in 2018, the Queensland Mental Health Week Mental Health Achievement Award in 2013 and most recently the TheMHS Exceptional Contribution Award at the 2019 Mental Health Service Awards of Australia and New Zealand for her exceptional contribution to mental health.

Brenda retired from full time work in June 2018 and current works part time as a Professor of Nursing, University of Newcastle. She believes in giving back and will continue to advocate for mental health nursing at every opportunity.





MERYL CALDWELL-SMITH AM ACMHN LIFETIME CONTRIBUTION 2019

Born in Melbourne, Meryl commenced nursing in 1945. After returning from overseas she took up the position as Matron firstly at Karitane Mothercraft Centre; then Grosvenor Hospital and finally Marsden Hospital.

In 1974 Meryl attended the first conference of the "Australian Congress of Mental Health Nurses" held at Broadbeach Qld, Nurses from the areas of Psychiatry, Geriatrics and Mental Retardation attended and develop the first constitution.

In 1978 Meryl was appointed Chairman of the NSW Nurses Registration Board, Director of the Division of Nursing, NSW Department of Health, as well as Chief Nursing Officer State Emergency Services Nursing Reserve. These positions Meryl held until her retirement. In honour of her lifetime achievements in nursing, leadership and administration she was awarded the Member of the Order of Australia. AM.

Meryl became the first Life Member in 1988 and a foundation Fellow in 1992. She was for many years the College Archivist and became the inaugural Patron of the College a position she held until 2007.

She has been a member of Soroptimist International since 1956 and is still active, having held office to the highest level. She is the Secretary and Music Librarian for a local choir in which she sings at Bowral.

As a Living Treasure of the College, Meryl's outstanding contribution has been inspirational, exceptional, substantial and enduring. Her warm smile and good cheer has been a welcome to nurses attending the College Conferences.

ABOUT THE ORATION

Evidence, Compassion and Human Rights: The Right Treatment/The Right to Treatment

In recent decades organisations such as the United Nations and World Health Organization have called for the adoption of internationally recognised standards of service provision that incorporate human rights principles and practices. At the same time commentators such as Arthur Kleinman have argued that a significant barrier to mental health is moral in that individuals with mental illness exist in poor environmental conditions and governments, as stewards of citizenry, have often failed to protect them.

In Australia, mental health policy and practice have been influenced by ideas such as evidence based practice and recovery focused mental health care and yet we still struggle to provide effective care for people living with mental illness. Professor Hazelton will consider borderline personality disorder as an issue for both evidence based practice and human rights. We can and ought to be doing better in helping people who live with borderline personality disorder. In doing so we are likely to become more effective and compassionate practitioners.
